Rangeland Management

Project Outline: This project works to secure the sustainability of the mixed farming/rangelands and rangelands management unit.

There are a number of components attached to this project. They involve the adoption of Best Management Practice (BMP) for sustainable grazing by providing an improvement in the condition of native vegetation, to ensure that they meet targets outlined in the Lower Murray Darling Catchment Blueprint. It will also entail the implementation of Threatened Species Recovery Plans.

Other actions attached to this project include:

- Feral carnivorous pest management programs to control foxes, cats & pigs.
- Remote Area Sensing Imagery will be purchased and analysed to determine vegetation cover;
- Collection and interpretation of Landscape Function Analysis data;
- Support provided to implement the Rangelands Incentives Strategy (RIS) and Property Vegetation plans (PVP);
- Implementation commenced for terrestrial Threatened Species Recovery Plans.

3 Year Investment: the Natural Heritage Trust (\$1,240,837) and the State Sustainability Fund (\$449,339) jointly fund this project.



Administration: The LMDCMA, Rural lands Protection Boards and Department of Environment and Conservation will implement portions of this project this project.

Project Duration: This will be an ongoing project, initially being implemented for three years, from 2004/5 until 2006/07.
